Goal: Student Chronic Absenteeism will be reduced through Family and Student Intervention (pp. 7-16)

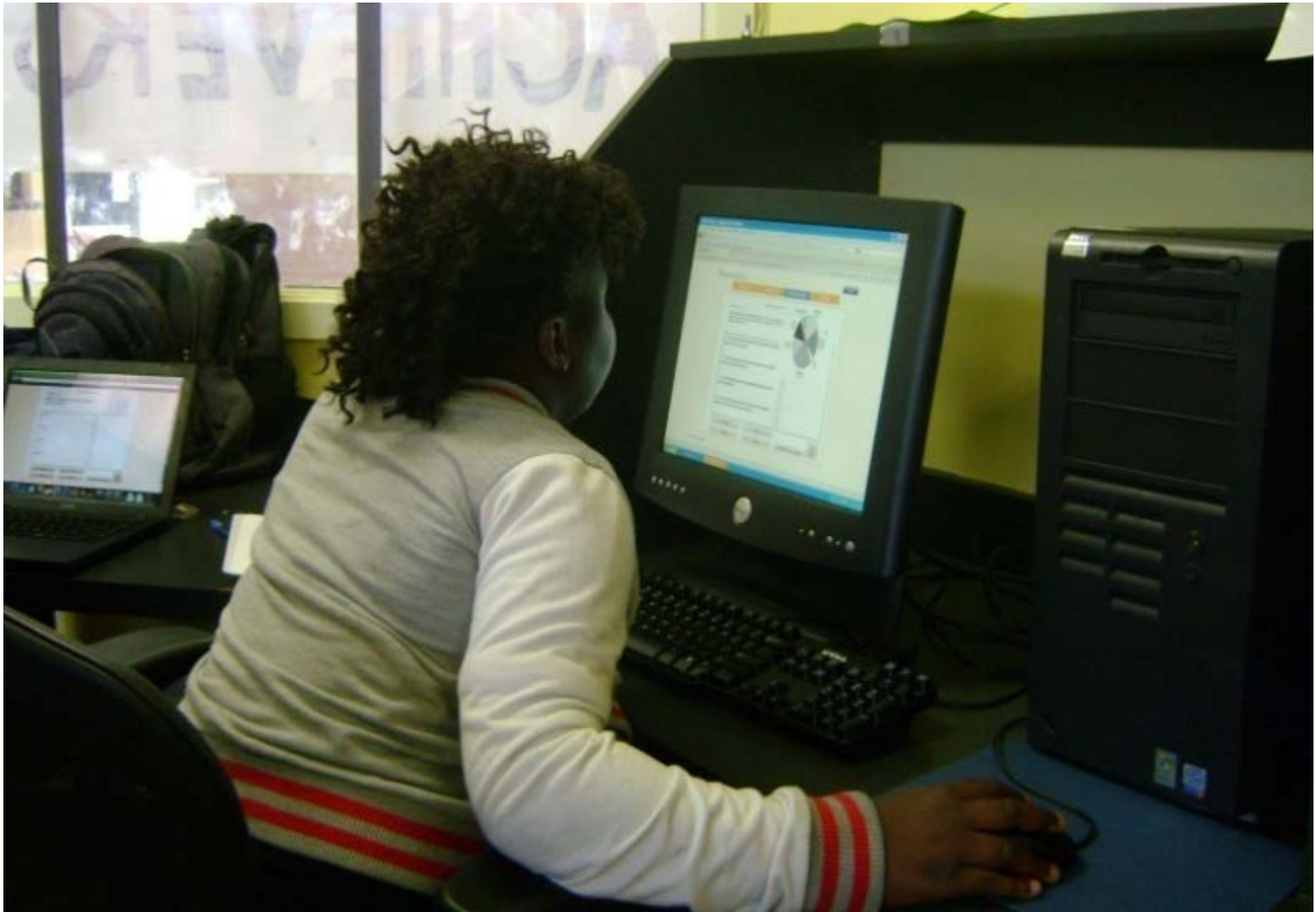
