

## 2019 Cal Football Game Day Community Briefing (Summary Notes)

### Key Topics & Presenters

#### 1) Overview of 2019 Home Game Schedule--Joe Mulford, Senior Associate Athletics Director

#### 2) Overview Public Safety & Emergency Response--BPD Lt. Randy Files, UCPD Lt. Lee Harris; BFD Assistant Chief Keith May

On Game Days—BPD has purview over public safety issues outside the stadium and all city streets. Best way to report an issue or request support is to call 911 and note that this is a “football issue” so that the command center will route concern to Lt. Files and his team. UCPD, has responsibility for issues in stadium and on campus. Lt. Lee Harris is point for UCPD on Gameday. Call UCPD non-emergency number (510.642.6760) to report incidents that require UCPD attention.

Berkeley Fire is responsible for emergency response. Oakland Fire also has a unit stationed at top of Panoramic Hill. Call 911 for assistance and proper routing.

#### 3) Parking and Traffic Circulation (Lt. Randy Files, Farid Javandel, Seamus Wilmot)

Starting this fall, parking enforcement in some residential neighborhoods adjacent to the stadium will become more restrictive on game days--per Council’s modification of game day fines and tow away zones. See attached flier for details.

Also, the City/Campus team will experiment with traffic circulation strategies designed to move fans out of the vicinity of the stadium more efficiently using Hearst and Bancroft.

#### 4) Facilities & Post-Game Clean Up (Gordon Bayne & Erin Steffen)

City and campus will partner again to do additional solid waste removal in adjacent neighborhoods. Cal Athletics will ensure post game clean up after night games is minimal; leaving task that involve loud equipment to the next morning

### **Next Steps & Follow Up Items**

Please see attached 2019 Fact Sheet, which contains extensive information about the steps the City/Campus Game Day Operations Team undertakes to ensure the needs of fans and residents of adjacent neighborhoods are accounted for. In addition, below is a summary of concerns raised by community members, including responses and follow up steps.

#### **Parking:**

- **Parking Placards for Neighborhood Residents.** Berkeley Parking and Transportation Prints and Distributes the Placards. Contact Farid Javandel to get additional placards. Farid also clarified that residents can also contact Parking and Transportation to ensure license numbers for cars registered to them are included in data base that parking enforcement officers use in the field. This should ensure their cars are not inadvertently ticketed or towed.
- **Impact of new enhanced game day parking on K permit holders on Panoramic Hill.** **Jacquelyn McCormick** will take the lead on City Council action to fix this. She will confer with **Janice Thomas** and Hank.
- **City and Campus messaging** to residents and fans on **enhanced Game Day Parking Fines Enforcement and No Parking/Tow Away Zones.** **Cal Athletics** is doing outreach to ticket holders and fans. Jeff Woods, Fran Albergo will get info to IFC/Panhellenic leaders. **Jacquelyn McCormick** agreed to serve on city messaging. **Janice Thomas** will be a key conduit to the neighbors.
- Promoting the use of City's Downtown Parking Garage (on Addison) on game day. **Danette Perry** (Public Works) is point of contact for information on special rates at parking garages; **Joe** will make sure that this information (along with other parking updates) is posted online.
- **Signs Restricting Bus Parking Next to Alpha Phi Sorority.** **Gloria Kaci** will work with Timothy Smith on this.
- **City restrictions on street parking for special events in the stadium.** The city team confirmed that this has happened for a rental event only once; and there are no plans to restrict street parking for rental events in the stadium.

### **Additional Issues:**

- **TV Network's Use of Generators.** Cal Athletics confirmed that games that are broadcasted by the PAC-12 Network do not involve generators. When the game is broadcast by other networks, those companies test their generator the day before the game; and turn it off by 8PM. Also, the networks must contract with a local vendor that can provide generators that meet all Air Resources Board regulations. Joe Mulford is the lead for any additional follow that may be needed.
